Emergency Obstetrics: Help! There's a Pregnant Patient in my Triage!



Course Description

Presented in lecture format, this course is designed for emergency department and obstetric nurses to review how the anatomical and physiological changes of pregnancy affect the care of pregnant and postpartum women in an emergency department. The major components include: a review of anatomical and physiological adaptations to pregnancy and the postpartum period; common medical and obstetrical complications that cause pregnant women to seek emergency medical care; triage; trauma; fetal assessment; modifications to BLS, ACLS and ATLS/ATCN algorithms for pregnant patients; and the importance of establishing a collaborative relationship between EMS, the Emergency Department and the Labor & Delivery unit.

Program Learning Outcomes

This program prepares the learner to:

- Describe the anatomical and physiological adaptations of pregnancy and the postpartum period.
- Gain a further understanding of the common reasons obstetric patients seek emergency medical care.
- Identify how triage and emergency nursing assessments and interventions are affected during the puerperium.
- Discuss the importance of collaboration between EMS, Emergency Department and Labor & Delivery.
