# **Essentials of Pain Management**



### **Course Description**

This two-day seminar is designed to follow the blueprint for the Pain Management Nursing Board Certification, but it is also relevant for all nurses caring for patients in pain. The course addresses both acute and chronic pain syndromes of all ages. The course will also cover specialty populations, such as the cognitively impaired and addicts. It includes various aspects of pain: physiology, assessment, interventions that include both non-pharmacological treatments and complementary alternatives, crisis management and the ethics of pain.

### **Program Learning Outcomes**

This program prepares the learner to:

- Discuss the physiology of the pain process, including the transmission, perception and modulation of pain.
- Describe the components of a complete pain assessment and identify tools available for recording the pain assessment.
- Discuss the difference between opioid, nonopioid and adjuvant therapy, and identify the general side effects of each.
- Identify common side effects of spinal analgesia and state the indications for transdermal and PCA.
- Identify the alternative and complementary therapies used for pain management.
- Discuss the ethical issues of pain management in end-of-life care.
