Trauma Nuts & Bolts

Course Description

There are many challenges that face healthcare providers today. Some of these challenges are related to the patient's injuries or illness, provider's knowledge and experience, and the healthcare system as a whole. Trauma patients are often viewed as a challenge. They can be complex and difficult to manage, and never present the same. One way to lessen these challenges is through education and experience. This course will provide an overview of the different aspects of trauma care. It will review the basics as well as the some of the advanced areas of trauma management. This course will provide an in-depth overview of trauma care for the less experienced provider, and even some new information for the seasoned attendee. Several topics will be reviewed including assessment, specific injury management, complications and lastly, the legal aspects of management.

- Discuss the mechanism of injury and its utilization in assessment and detection of injuries to various body systems.
- Describe the physiology of shock and discuss the management of hemorrhagic shock in a multisystem trauma patient.

- Describe the care of special trauma patients including bariatric, pregnant, elderly and pediatric trauma patients.
